# Competitions

## BCIT Engineering Competition (BEC)

The BCIT Engineering Students' Society (ESS) proudly hosts the annual BCIT Engineering Competition (BEC). This event brings together the best and brightest undergraduate engineering students from BCIT to showcase their technical, communication, and innovative skills across 8 different challenging categories.

BEC is more than just a competition, it's a gateway to larger opportunities. Winning teams qualify to represent BCIT at the Western Engineering Competition (WEC), where they compete against students from 11 other universities across Western Canada. Successful teams can then advance to the national level, highlighting BCIT's talent on a broader stage.



## Western Engineering Competition (WEC)

Since 1985, the Western Engineering Competition (WEC) has been one of the largest and most prestigious undergraduate engineering competitions in Western Canada, hosted under the umbrella of the Western Engineering Students' Societies' Team (WESST). Each year, 200–300 competitors from across the region gather for a five-day event. Winners then advance to the Canadian Engineering Competition (CEC) to compete against students across all of Canada.

In 2026, WEC will be hosted by the University of Alberta in Edmonton, providing BCIT students with an incredible opportunity to showcase their skills, connect with peers from across the country, and gain exposure within the broader engineering community.

# Categories

## JUNIOR/SENIOR DESIGNS

Teams of four students are tasked with designing and building a prototype to solve an engineering problem. Senior students

have three or eight hours to devise a solution and present their prototype to the judges while junior students in their first and second years are given two hours to do the same for their own unique problem.

## DEBATE

Teams of two present their arguments for or against a topic disclosed only minutes prior to the competition to a panel of judges.

Presentations are evaluated on the competitors ability to create well-constructive, persuasive arguments. Topics range from the philosophical, to social issues, to current events.

## PROGRAMMING

Teams of four receive the competition theme and logistics, then begin with a formal problem presentation outlining expectations. A 15 minute Q&A follows, with all questions and answers later shared to ensure fairness. Teams then have two or six hours to develop their solution, prepare a brief presentation, and produce all required deliverables.

## RE-ENGINEERING

Teams of two spend eight hours improving upon an existing engineering design. Their redesigned concept is judged on practicality, originality, feasibility and marketability.

## COMMUNICATION

Teams of one or two students are tasked with describing a complex technical subject in simple terms to a non-technical audience. Presentations also include the effects and impacts on both society and the environment. Competitors are graded on the clarity and effectiveness of the overall presentation and their communication skills.

## CONSULTING

Teams of four students are given six hours to create a solution for a real-world problem while considering the economic, social and environmental impacts of their solution. They then present their solution to a panel of industry-expert judges for evaluation.

## INNOVATION

Teams have the opportunity to present an original product or idea in a tradeshow style demonstration that is open to all conference attendees. Designs are judged based on technical merit, functionality, and marketability.

# Networking Events

The BCIT Engineering Students' Society (ESS) is proud to host the 2026 Spring Networking Event, bringing together over a hundred engineering students and industry professionals for an evening of connection and opportunity. Students from a wide range of disciplines—including Civil, Electrical, Mining, and Mechanical—will come together to explore career paths, industry trends, and professional growth.

For sponsors, this event creates a unique platform to engage with BCIT's engineering students—an eager and talented group preparing to enter the workforce. Companies are invited to set up booths, meet students, and build lasting professional connections. To maximize value, sponsors receive student resumes in advance, allowing them to prepare for focused conversations and highlight opportunities within their organizations.

These 3- to 5-hour events serve as a bridge between the classroom and industry, helping to shape the future of engineering while giving companies early access to the next generation of innovators and problem-solvers.



## Panel Events

Panel events provide students with the opportunity to connect directly with industry professionals and companies in an engaging and interactive setting. These sessions allow students to ask questions, gain insight into industry practices, and network with speakers before, after, or even during intermissions.

For companies, panel events serve as a platform to highlight their organization, share expertise, and connect with students who are genuinely interested in their field. Beyond showcasing career opportunities, these events inspire students who are exploring potential career paths and help guide them toward areas of interest within engineering.



# YEAR-LONG SPONSORSHIPS



# Terms & Conditions

## › Payment & Fees

- Payment Methods: Sponsors can choose to pay by cheque or EFT as outlined in the sponsorship package. EFT is the preferred payment method.
- Due Date: All sponsorship payments must be made within 30 days of invoice receipt. Failure to meet this deadline may result in the suspension or revocation of sponsorship privileges until full payment is received.
- Upgrade to Sponsorship Tier: Sponsors can upgrade their sponsorship tier at any time during the fiscal year by paying the difference in tier prices. This will apply retroactively to benefits

## › Confidentiality


- Non-disclosure: BCIT ESS agrees to keep all confidential information provided by sponsors private and secure. This includes financial details, business strategies, and any non-public information exchanged during the sponsorship term.
- Sponsor's Confidential Information: Sponsors should clearly label any information provided to BCIT ESS as confidential if it is not meant to be disclosed to the public.
- Use of Sponsor's Logo and Materials: By becoming a sponsor, companies give BCIT ESS the right to use their logos, bios, and promotional materials for the purposes outlined in the sponsorship package. Any sensitive or proprietary materials that sponsors do not want to be shared publicly should be clearly marked.

## › Cancellation

- Sponsor-Initiated Cancellation: Sponsors may cancel their sponsorship at any time with a 30-day written notice to BCIT ESS. In such cases, refunds will be issued on a pro-rata basis for the remainder of the fiscal year, minus any administrative costs.
- BCIT ESS-Initiated Cancellation: BCIT ESS reserves the right to cancel sponsorship if the sponsor fails to meet its obligations, including failure to pay within the outlined payment period. No refunds will be issued for cancellations made under these circumstances.
- Force Majeure: Neither party will be held liable for any cancellation or suspension of sponsorship benefits due to events beyond their control, such as natural disasters, governmental actions, or other emergencies.

## › Additional terms

- Modification of Sponsorship Perks: Sponsorship benefits are subject to change. Should any changes occur, sponsors will be entitled to any additional benefits added during the fiscal year, as noted in the package.
- Term of Sponsorship: Sponsorship benefits, including branding and event participation, are valid until May 31st of the fiscal year. Any new sponsorship must be initiated to continue benefits beyond this date.
